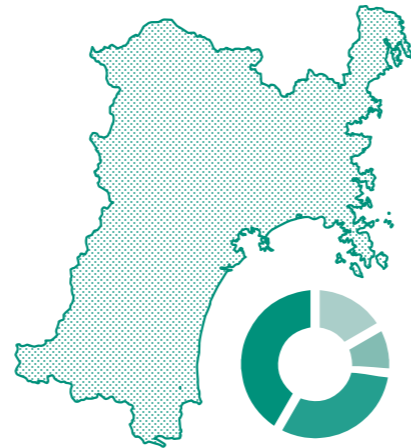


Data on Miyagi's Recovery

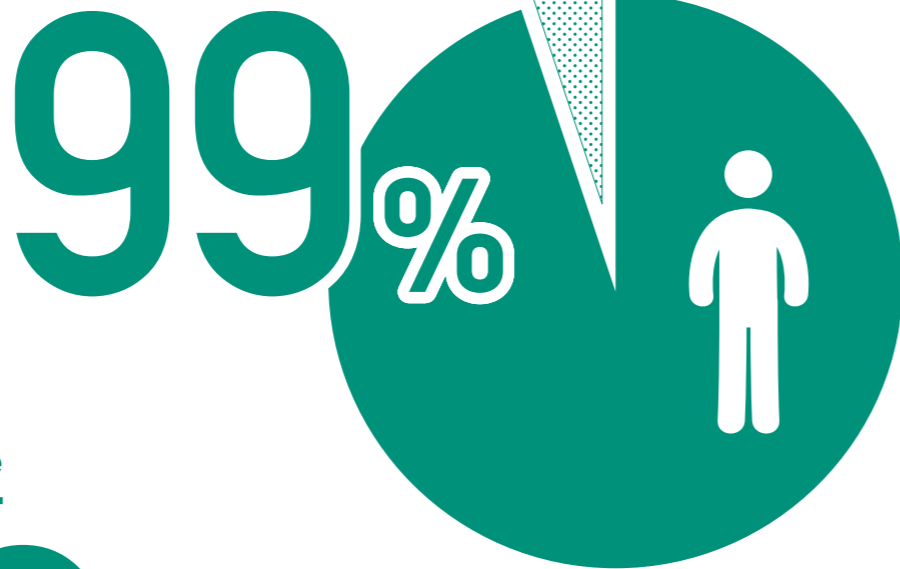
The Great East Japan Earthquake struck five years ago. Here, we provide a snapshot of the state of recovery of Miyagi Prefecture through infographics.

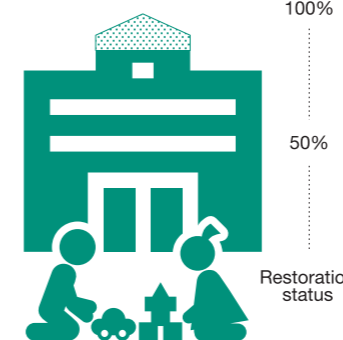

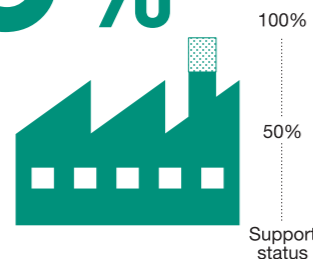

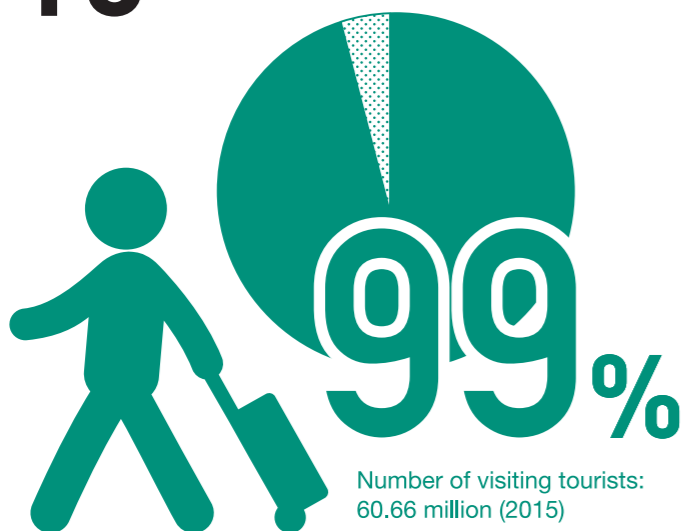


14 Support by group subsidy for SMEs and other groups

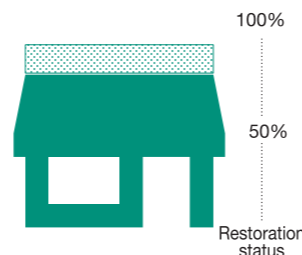

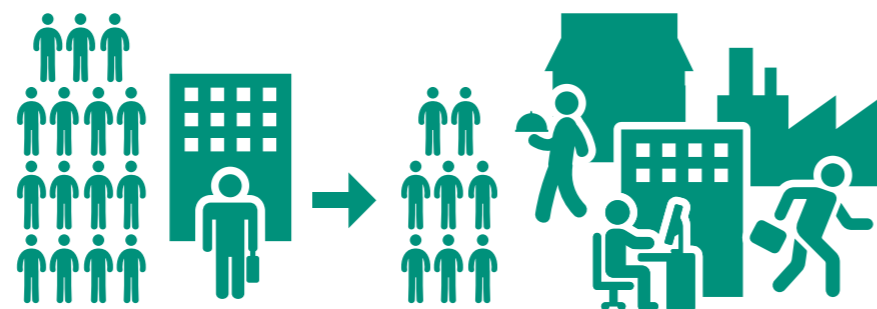

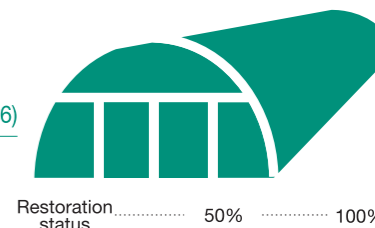

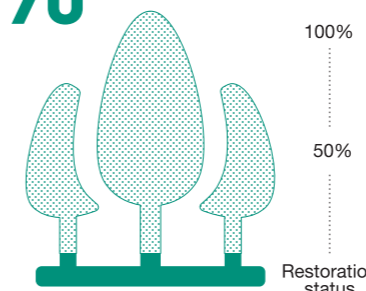

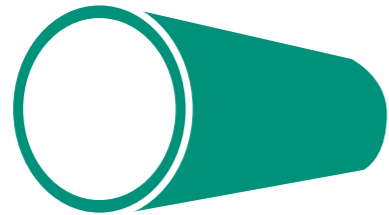

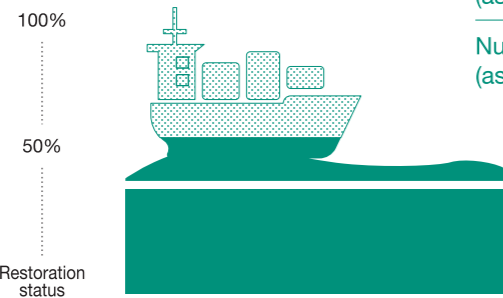

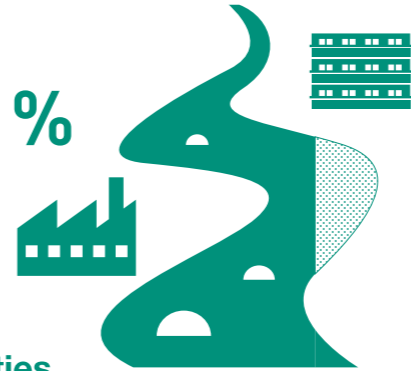

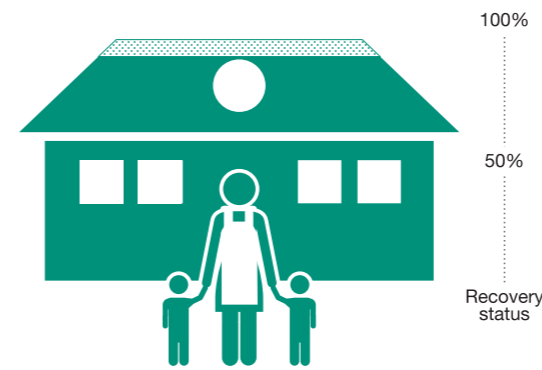
